


OUR MISSION: To create opportunities for individuals and families to reach self-sufficiency through support services, education, employment, and leadership.



STABLE FAMILIES

Serving families with children in grades K-3 in Campbell or Boone Counties that are at imminent risk of homelessness to stabilize their housing situation. The ideal outcome is that children maintain school stability and grade promotion.



SENIOR SUPPORT

Serving seniors living at Brighton Properties' Saratoga Place I and II Apartments along with Two Rivers Apartments to connect them with services that will allow seniors to "age in place."



COMMUNITY GARDENS & MOBILE MARKETS

Newport residents have access to grow their own fresh foods through the Newport Community Gardens project. A group of passionate community members, supporters, and organizations came together in the fall of 2014 to build nearly 172 4' by 8' lowmaintenance, raised-bed gardens. This collaborative project began with community partners working together to accomplish two goals:

(1) increase access to fresh vegetables for the residents.

(2) increase knowledge of ways to grow, harvest, and cook the vegetables so everyone can enjoy a healthier diet.

SAFETY NET ALLIANCE
